
The PHAIR voice for the FUTURE Ward 4



EARLIER THIS YEAR, when I made my decision to ask for your support to represent Ward 4 for another three years, I took some time to reflect on my effectiveness in the past and to consider what is best for the future. The past nine years as your Councillor for Ward 4 have been an exciting and rewarding experience for me. I feel good about the positive results and am disappointed by the negative results, but I say with pride that I listened to your concerns and made my decisions based on what I heard.

The citizens of Ward 4 have an incredible range of interests and concerns, making it a very diverse ward. If you re-elect me to represent Ward 4 for the next three years, I will continue to take into account the various points of view and make decisions in your best interests. At this time, I think some of the important areas that I will work on include the following:

I will continue to work for improvements in the diverse transportation needs of the residents of Ward 4. In the past three years, I succeeded in increasing the funding for the Disabled Adults Transportation System (DATS) each year in the City Budget. For the year 2002, I will advocate strongly for the extension of the LRT.

I believe the arts enrich the lives of all citizens and I will continue to work on behalf of arts organizations in Edmonton in the same way I worked to get money from all three levels of government to save our excellent choral music group, Pro Coro Canada.

I will continue to celebrate the quality of life issues that touch all citizens in many ways. I am proud of my involvement with Communities in Bloom, a

project that brings colour and beauty to the City each summer as residents and businesses actively participate in making the City more attractive by cleaning up and using flowers, shrubs, and trees.

Finally, I will continue to strengthen the City's ties with all levels of government. I recognize the importance of having Edmonton on the provincial and federal agendas and will continue to foster alliances through my work on the National Board of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities.

Looking to the future, I offer my experience and will continue to be an effective voice for Ward 4. I promise to bring my personal integrity to Council and demand respect for the diverse interests of the citizens of Ward 4.







SMART GROWTH

Michael Phair will encourage smart growth with an emphasis on revitalizing downtown, the development of vacant land in core/central communities, and the repair and better use of existing infrastructures like roads and sewers.

SMART FUTURE

Michael Phair will be diligent in his efforts to reverse the decline in neighbour-hoods caused by derelict housing that lowers property values; the closure of schools; and the deterioration of facilities like recreation centres and libraries. Last term Michael inaugurated a committee with the two local school boards in order to build a better relationship to deal with issues like schools closures. In the Boyle Street area Michael applauds the community efforts to remove derelict housing by forcing owners to repair it or have it torn down.

SMART VOICE

Michael Phair recognizes the importance for our City to be on the provincial and federal agendas, especially in financial matters, and will continue to reach out. He is a Federation of Canadian Municipalities board member and has achieved federal funding for affordable housing in the continuing battle against homelessness. The new National Infrastructure Program will bring \$90 million to Edmonton.

SMART CHOICE

Michael Phair will promote improvements in quality of life for residents and the overall attractiveness for the City by protecting our river valley and green areas; extending recycling programs to multi-family dwellings and high-rises; and increasing trees, shrubs and flowers in public spaces.


